

Our Founders



Our church began in 1811 when several families in the area met with Reverend Samuel Baldridge. Perhaps our beginnings really began as a seed when our founding members made the decision to leave the comfort of their homes and the embrace of family and friends and move westward. Without their bravery and desires, the west would have remained a wilderness.

Robert and Phoebe Marvin were two of our earliest members. Phoebe Marvin's diary has


given us an insight into their trip as they left Morristown, New Jersey. The final entry of Phoebe's diary of her trip from Dover, NJ to Ohio ended In Linnsome on June 17, 1805, just upstream of Gallipolis. Robert and Phoebe's arrival in the Ohio Valley was not the end of they journey, because they continued on and settled in Harrison in the fall of 1805. Six years later they and other founders of our church met for the first time at John Allen's log cabin with a traveling minister named Rev. Samuel Baldridge.
