

"Keep or Give"

What should we keep, and what should we give away? That seems like a simple question, and yet it's often a rather complicated one. One thing I've learned over the years is that often couples are made up of one spouse who wants to keep *everything*, and one who wants to get rid of *everything*. Sometimes, hilarity ensues from that combination; other times, friction ensues. And sometimes, those keeping and giving urges can be taken to extremes. The popular TV show *Hoarders* features people who compulsively collect things to the point that it adversely affects their lives. On the other end, Japanese lifestyle guru Marie Kondo has made a name for herself by promoting a lifestyle of stark simplicity; she advocates only keeping things that "spark joy." I can only imagine what would happen if a hoarder lived with a follower of Kondo's method! There would certainly be some friction!

The Bible talks about things we should keep and things we should get rid of, as well, and not surprisingly, the organizing principle is *love*. As Christians known by our love (Cf John 13), we are to be people who keep our promises. We are to be people who keep our word – we say what we mean and we mean what we say, and we follow through on the things we say we're going to do. Similarly, in answer to Cain's age-old question, we are to be our brothers' and sisters' keepers, as well (Cf Genesis 4). In love, we are to care for them, provide for them when they need help, pray for them, protect them when we can, and in general, do all we can do to show love and care for them. Those are things that, in love, we are called to keep.

On the other hand, because of that same love, there are things we need to get rid of. The big one is bitterness and unforgiveness. Those things are incompatible with love, and the Bible is clear that we are to root them out of our lives (Cf Hebrews 12:15). Paul clearly teaches that love "keeps no record of wrongs" (1 Corinthians 13:5, NIV), and Jesus teaches over and over that if we are to truly receive His love and forgiveness, then we must be willing to give that same love and forgiveness to others (Cf Matthew 6 and 18). Of course, that's always easier said than done – but still, Jesus doesn't give us any wiggle-room here. When we are called to account for how we have chosen to live, I don't think God is going to allow the excuse that we didn't forgive because it was hard or we just didn't feel like it!

So, this month, as you gather up all the receipts you have kept to get ready to do your taxes, and as you begin thinking about spring cleaning and cleaning out closets and drawers, spend some time thinking about the spiritual things you should keep and purge. For God's love for us demands that we grow more and more in His image and likeness - that is, we are called more and

more to love each other as Jesus loves us (Cf. John 13)! So let us get rid of the things that trip us up and entangle us, and let us keep His love in our hearts and minds - and to Him alone be the glory!

Adult Sunday School





Outreach Committee



Healing Prayer is available upon request. All who wish to receive anointing, the laying on of hands, and prayers for healing are welcome to call the church office.






Young Youth Group



Christianity Today recently published an article "Top 5 Heresies Among American Evangelicals." Aren't you curious about what those top heresies might be, and how we can avoid them? Please join us during the Season of Lent as Joshua preaches a 4-week sermon series on these errors and the truth that Scripture teaches to contradict them. - * **25 February:** "No Other Name" (John 14:1-6, Acts 4:1-13). Common Heresy: *Jesus isn't the only way to God.*
- * **3 March:** "No, Not One!" (Psalm 15:1-9, Romans 3:9-26). Common Heresy: *Humans aren't sinful by nature.*
- * **10 March:** "Jesus, the One and Only" (John 10:22-42, John 14:8-11). Common Heresies: Jesus was only a great teacher; Jesus wasn't fully God or fully human, etc.
- * **17 March:** "Live By the Spirit" (John 14:15-31, Galatians 5:16-26). Common Heresy: *The Spirit is an impersonal force, not a personal being.*
