

"A Righteous Remnant"

The statistics are depressing. Perhaps you've seen some of the research that has been done recently on the state of the American Church which only confirms the trend that so many of us have been observing over the past several decades. According to a Pew Research Center study conducted in 2021 (so these stats are already a little bit out of date!), only 1 in 4 Americans now attend worship weekly. That means that on any given Sunday, 75% of Americans are *not* attending church! Wowzers!

Now, there are a variety of ways we can respond to this. We can become smugly self-righteous, sitting in our pews while calmly saying to the world, "Well, if you all want to go to hell, then that's on you!" Or, we can get all caught up in worry and anxiety and fear, feverishly biting our fingernails and rubbing our foreheads as we fret over what we're going to do – how we're going to keep people from leaving and how we're going to get more people attending. Many Christians have elected to do one or both of those options in these uncertain times of upheaval and change. I personally don't find either of them helpful, though I have on occasion slipped into both states of mind!

But there's another option open to us, which is to recognize that what we are experiencing is actually nothing new. For true faith in God has always - always - been a minority religion. Here's what the late Eugene Peterson has to say about all this:

These trials force us, if we are to stay true to the story we are reading, to give up the notion that the Christian community, rightly and obediently lived, can somehow, if we just put our minds to it, be tarted up sufficiently to catch the admiring eye of the world. We have ample documentation by now to disabuse us of such stuff. Eighteen hundred years or so of Hebrew history capped by a full exposition in Jesus Christ tell us that God's revelation of himself is rejected far more often than it is accepted, is dismissed by far more people than embrace it, and has been either attacked or ignored by every major culture or civilization in which it has given its witness: magnificent Egypt, fierce Assyria, beautiful Babylon, artistic Greece, political Rome, Enlightenment France, Nazi Germany, Renaissance Italy, Marxist Russia, Maoist China, and pursuit-of-happiness America. The community of God's people has survived in all of these cultures and civilizations but always as a minority, always marginal to the mainstream, never statistically significant. Paul was acerbically brief: "Not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth...God chose what was low and despised in the world." (1 Cor 1:26, 28).²

Peterson describes here what Jesus Himself teaches: that His Way is a *narrow way, and that few find it* (Matthew 7:13). The Good News is that God provides a way in the first place – that's the evidence of His amazing grace and amazing love. But still – it's a narrow way. Few find it. That's how it always has been; that's how it always will be. We don't need to fret and worry and fear, nor should we smugly sit back in our pews and pat ourselves on the back for being so much wiser than the rest of the world. Instead, we need to recognize this and to be motivated by it to keep reaching out with the Good News to snatch as many away from the fires of judgment as possible (Jude 1:23). We will never be popular. But it's not about being popular – it's about being faithful, and above all, it's about being with Jesus! And He has come to give His life for us and for our salvation! That is our message, our power, and our comfort in the midst of troubles and strife!

This Lent, let's rejoice in the narrow way Jesus provides us through His life, His death, and His resurrection – and let's share that Good News with our world, hoping and praying that *some*, at least, will come to know and love Him as we do! Hallelujah! To Him alone be the glory!





Christianity Today recently published an article "Top 5 Heresies Among American Evangelicals." Aren't you curious about what those top heresies might be, and how we can avoid them? - * **17 March:** "Live By the Spirit" (John 14:15-31, Galatians 5:16-26). Common Heresy: *The Spirit is an impersonal force, not a personal being.*
