"Now What?"

I don't know about you, but I sometimes find this time of year to be a bit of a let-down. After all, we have celebrated the Resurrection; we have celebrated the most joyful holiday of the Christian year. We've celebrated the Good News of our salvation, proven once-for-all at the cross and the empty tomb. We've hit that mountain-top high. So now what?

Like I said, it can feel like a bit of let-down since it is impossible to sustain that level of joy and celebration everyday. Inevitably, we have to come down to the business of figuring out how to *live* as people of the resurrection – and that is much, much harder than just celebrating the resurrection. Being resurrection people, being people of the empty tomb, being *Christians* is much more difficult – because it isn't natural. We have to fight against our sinful nature to live that way, and that is counter-cultural and counter-intuitive. It's something we have to *learn*, a new way of life we have to put into practice.

And it's all-encompassing. Being a follower of Jesus puts a claim on every part of our lives. There is no piece of our lives that Jesus does not claim as His own. There is no piece of our lives that Jesus does not want to heal and transform. As Paul tells us in Romans 12, we are called to "present (our) bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is (our) spiritual worship" (Romans 12:1b, ESV). In other words, we are to lay our bodies, and indeed, our whole lives, down on the proverbial altar as a sacrifice to God. We are to give our very selves to Him as an offering. In gratitude for all He has given for us and how He came to live and to die and to live again for us, we now are to live our lives as an offering to Him.

And if you want guidance on how to do that, you can find it throughout the New Testament. But I've found that, if you want to focus on just one chapter as a guide for living the Christian life, you could do worse than looking at Romans 12. Besides teaching about being living sacrifices and about humility as a member of the Body of Christ, Paul then goes on to give this list of teachings:

Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. ¹⁰ Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹ Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹² Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. ¹³ Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality.

¹⁴ Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵ Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁶ Live in harmony with one another. Do not be

haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight. ¹⁷ Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. ¹⁸ If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. ¹⁹ Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." ²⁰ To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head." ²¹ Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. (Romans 12:9-21, ESV)

Paul covers a lot of territory there, doesn't he? He talks about love. He talks about generosity and showing hospitality. He talks about forgiveness. He talks about showing love and kindness to our neighbors and even to our enemies. He talks about patience, hope, prayer, zeal . . . it's a pretty comprehensive list! And taken all together, it can be a bit overwhelming.

Which is why I challenge each of us to pick just one thing from Romans 12 to focus on this month. What if we each chose *one thing* – one teaching, one idea, one commandment – and we made that the thing we are focusing on in this month? As people of the resurrection, as people of the empty tomb, as *Christians*, what if we each chose one thing to work on – perhaps being patient in affliction, or being generous and hospitable, or living at peace with others – and we prayerfully, faithfully made that something we strove to put into practice in our lives? What if we read Romans 12 each day this month and prayed that God would make it a part of us? What if we put a reminder on our bedroom mirror, or on the fridge, or on the car dashboard, to see each day? What if we asked a good friend to hold us accountable for this? What blessings would we see in our lives by the end of this month?

I hope you will prayerfully consider this as you live as a person of the resurrection this month! I will be joining you and will pray for you – will you also pray for me?

May the Lord bless us as we seek to live for Him! Hallelujah! To Him alone be the glory!



This month's memory verse is Romans 12:1:


