#### "Know Thyself"

"Know thyself." I remember learning this maxim during one of my philosophy classes in college.<sup>1</sup> It's pretty good advice, for, after all, if you don't know who you are, then you don't know what you need to do to become who you want to be, or who you ought to be! If you don't know who you are, then you can't live wisely, because you won't know how to control your behavior, or what triggers your need to be on your guard for, or any other number of things that we need to know to live well. There's a reason younger people tend to be more foolish – so many are still figuring out who they are; they're still in the process of gaining wisdom.

The Bible tells us that *the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom* (Proverbs 9:10). In other words, having a proper reverence and awe before God is the starting place for gaining wisdom in life – and if you don't start with a proper relationship with God, then you'll never become wise. This fits with what we were talking about earlier, since the Bible also tells us that humankind was created in the Image of God (Genesis 1:27). So, to know ourselves, we first have to know who God is, since we were created in His image. John Calvin, whose theology has helped to form our Reformed and Presbyterian tradition, famously writes that "it is certain that man never achieves a clear knowledge of himself unless he has first looked upon god's face, and then descends from contemplating him to scrutinizing himself."<sup>2</sup> The reason so many people are struggling so mightily in their quest for self-knowledge is that they are looking in all the wrong places – if we just look to God and to His Word, we will learn so much about ourselves!

But besides this, there are some very practical questions we can ask to learn about who we are – for instance, what is it that gets you really worked up? This will tell you a great deal about what is important to you, for good or for ill. In the Book of Jonah, we see the prophet getting really angry because God showed mercy and relented from destroying the people of Nineveh. That exposed an ugly side to Jonah's heart – his desire for his enemies to be destroyed! (See Jonah 4). Similarly, in the Gospels, we see Jesus weeping over the city of Jerusalem as He looks ahead in history and sees the terrible judgment coming upon the city for its rejection of their Savior (See Luke 19:41-44). Contrary to Jonah, Jesus is heartbroken that Jerusalem will be destroyed; Jonah is angry about the revival that happens while Jesus is heartbroken over the lack of it. Both incidents tell us a lot.

When I was young, whenever I would leave the house, my Dad would say to me "Remember who you are and Whose you are!"<sup>3</sup> The older I get, the more I see the wisdom in that saying, for we do remember who we are when we remember whose we are! And the more we know the One to whom we belong, the more wisdom we will have about our identity – about who we are, and about what we need to do to become who He wants us to be. As we learn these things, the more Christ-like we will be – and the more we will be stirred up by the things that stir His heart.

This month, pray that you would grow in your knowledge of God, and in wisdom to know your-self! And as always – to Him alone be the glory!

The next Library Book Club will be on July 16, 2024, in the library from 10am to noon. If you have any questions, contact Phyllis Pridemore.




We will need **donations of dessert items**, either homemade or from the *Meal Ministry* bakery/grocery store. Please let Tamela Hinson or Christine Luca know if you


